### Weekly Media Release

Over the last 14 days, Loon Lake RCMP have responded to 86 calls for service. Calls have varied from a plane crash near the Barthell area to routine animal complaints.

During the last few weeks, two detachment members have gone on extended paternity leave. Fortunately the detachment is being supplemented by the F-Division (Saskatchewan) Relief Unit.

The detachment has also said farewell to Cst Devon Garron and family as they have transferred to Beauval. In the coming months, we will be welcoming two new members. Cst Heather Healey and Cst Max Brie will be arriving from Depot in Regina. Cst Healey is from the Maritimes and Cst Brie from Montreal area.

In September, the Loon Lake members have been very involved in the schools. Cst Hale-Goddard gave a presentation to the Ministikwan School, while Cst Fenton has organized a three-session anti-bullying campaign at the Makwa School. Plans are also underway to implement a youth anti-gang strategy known as the Shield Program.

This coming weekend, Loon Lake RCMP will be conducting high visibility traffic enforcement and want to ensure the public is reminded to drive safe and make sure they have a sober ride home. Many times local RCMP will advertise these initiatives as prevention is more effective than enforcement, however there will be planned initiatives that are not announced and will not be high visibility with strictly enforcement in mind.
